Mission:

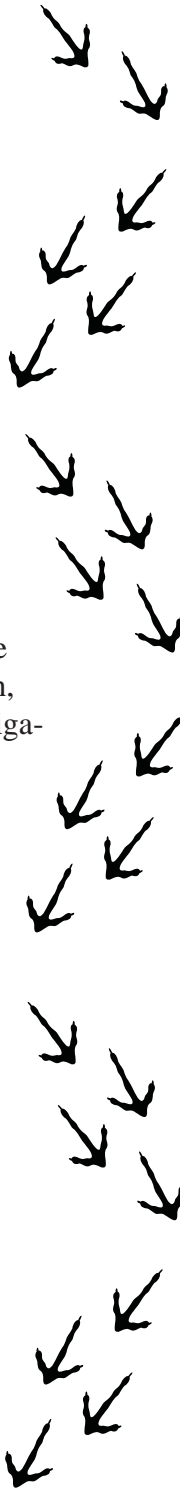
To provide skill, knowledge, and confidence to Wildlife Officers in the collection and reporting of data in the research of hunting related incidents.

Academy Overview:

Policies, planning an investigation, tools of the investigation, bullet-path reconstruction, evidence kits, ballistics, blood analysis, evidence collection, diagramming, methodology of the hunting investigation, and scenarios.

Registration Fee: \$400.00
